Last September the students participated in their training and practice expedition for their Duke of Edinburgh Silver Award.

The Friday consisted of pre-expedition training at the school, they learnt about navigation, emergency procedures, first aid, personal kit, and food to bring on the day. On Saturday they began their practice expedition in Little Baddow. Normally the participants would camp overnight however due to Covid-19 restrictions, things were a little different.

They practised their campcraft skills by setting up tents and used Trangia stoves to cook a meal and they cooked as individuals rather than as a team to ensure social distancing measures were met. Everything was then packed up and they went home for the evening.

They returned on Sunday morning and walked independently completing their practice expedition.

On 21st, 22nd and 23rd June 2021 our students completed their Qualifying Expedition and due to restrictions being more relaxed they were able to spend two nights in the Chiltern Hills. Our expedition provider, Adventure Expeditions, commented on how amazing our students were, all of them were extremely well behaved and always listened and followed instructions. We were exceptionally proud of them.

During the pandemic our students persevered and managed to complete their Volunteering, Physical and Skills activities. They had to amend the activities due to Covid-19 restrictions, from originally volunteering in a Library, they helped to home school a sibling or even got shopping for an elderly neighbour. We are so incredibly proud of our students and would like to celebrate their achievement especially during these hard times.
