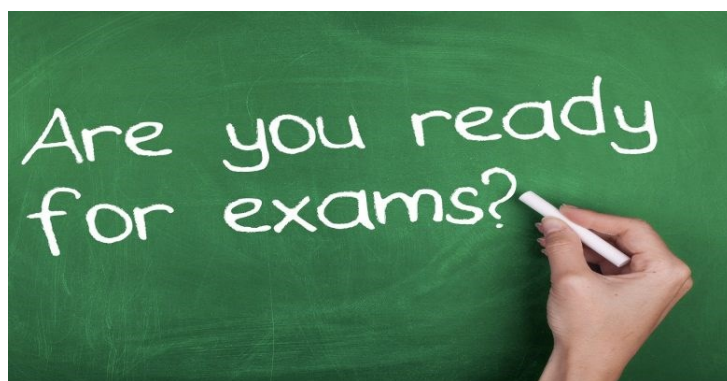

One of the panellists commented:

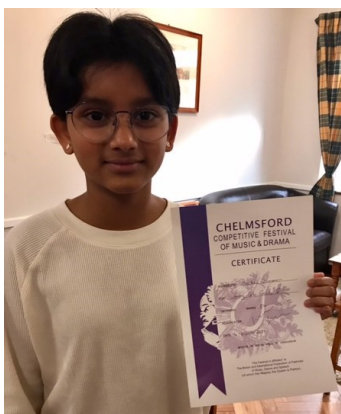
*'Diya – a confident musician - we really enjoyed meeting you and speaking with you today. Music is clearly a big part of your life'.*
