Engagement with organisations and helping to lead on girls' education

Firstly, forgive the number of organisation abbreviations which follow; but do stay with this section, though, as it outlines opportunities and projects for our school community. CCHS is a Committee Member of the Association of State Girls' Schools (ASGS), which provides our school with a national leading voice in our particular sector. Over the past three years, we have become more actively involved with the National Coalition of Girls' Schools (NCGS – based in the USA), which is the leading advocate for girls' schools internationally. In an important development, NCGS will be joining with other girls' school organisations in different countries, including our own ASGS, to form a new group: the International Coalition of Girls' Schools (ICGS), which will be formally launched in July 2022.

CCHS is now a member of the UK Advisory Board, as part of this project, and our school will work with colleagues from seven other schools in the country to steer this important work for girls' education. This will provide a range of significant opportunities for CCHS staff and students, as we work with colleagues and pupils nationally and internationally to progress excellence in girls' education and empowerment. In an interesting recent development, we have been contacted by the Chief Executive of the Girls' Schools Association (GSA), which represents girls' schools in the independent sector, to take part in the UK's biggest research collaboration for single-sex girls' schools.

I will learn more about this opportunity following a meeting next month; but again, it demonstrates that the quality of the work CCHS colleagues and students are undertaking, is gaining attention and respect, and opening doors to allow us to shape and lead girls' education and empowerment well beyond our campus.
