
Prethika, Year 9

Wind in the Willows Production



- CCHS is proud of the wide range of courses which its students go on to study at university and of the way in which the school helps so many students to follow their passions and study STEM subjects at the very highest level.
- In the last 5 years CCHS has seen 76 students go to university to study Medicine and Dentistry, 21 of them in 2020 alone.
 - In the same period an additional third of our leavers have gone on to study subjects such as Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Engineering, Mathematics and Computing.
- In total an average of 50% of our students choose to read a STEM subject at university. Over the years this has given our students a huge range of career opportunities.
- Former CCHS students can be found working as NHS consultants, as architects, as pioneers of scientific research, designing satellites and working at the cutting edge of engineering or software design – all of these are professions where men have traditionally dominated.

This week saw the school welcome a visiting examiner from Trinity College London to moderate our Years 9 and 10 Arts Award work. This time around we had 53 bronze entries (level 1 qualification) and 10 silver (level 2 qualification) entries. All students passed with flying colours!

These entries have taken a lot of time to put together over the last 18 months. The students have worked tremendously hard to complete this having to deal with everything thrown at them such as remote schooling and self isolation. The examiner was thrilled with the quality of work submitted and the wide variety of different art forms studied from cake decorating to music and dance to photography and many more.

Over the last 3 years the school has now had approximately 180 students achieve their bronze award which is superb and goes hand in hand with our work as an Artsmark school. Miss Burnham, Mr Copper and Mr Lamberti would like to congratulate all the students on their achievements.


