




ARTS WEEK 2022 - Wednesday 6th - Monday 11th

Industrial Cadets Bronze and Gold Projects - Celebration Day at Cambridge






On Wednesday, a group of Year 9 and Year 12 students attended the Industrial Cadets Celebration Day at the Department of Engineering, University of Cambridge.
