Senior Speech Day 2022

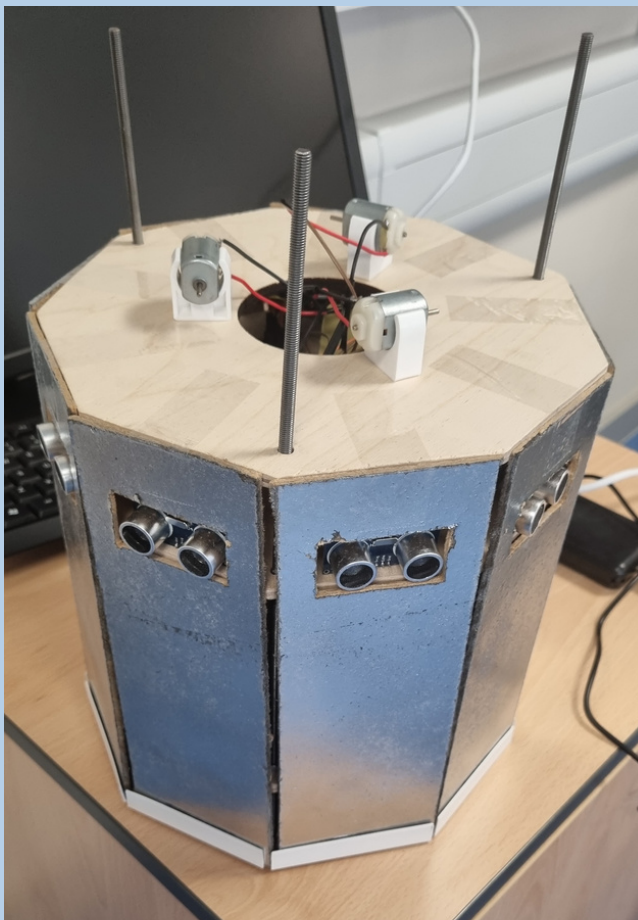

The Protector Project

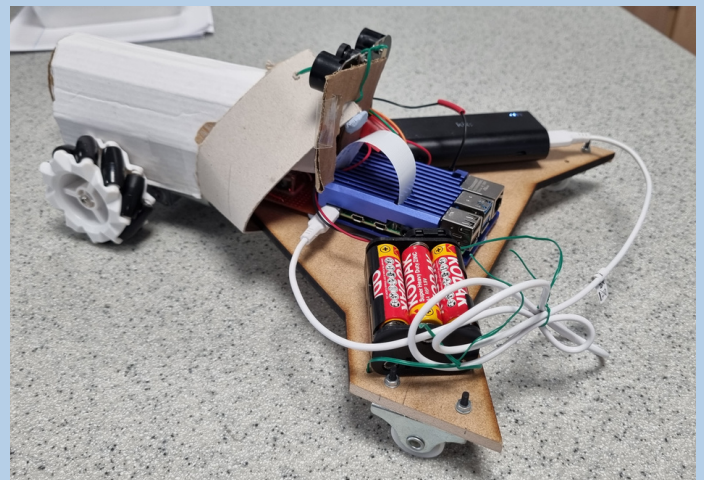
The protector is designed to detect a threat and send out warnings such as a noise, a high frequency sound, an irritant and a small explosive blast (we used party poppers!)



We were treated to a tour of Leonardo and spoke to a number of different engineers about the projects that they are currently working on. The groups then presented their projects to Senior engineers, who were all extremely impressed with the level of complexity in their projects and the students abilities in coding, design and manufacturing.

The Ferret Project

The ferret is designed to move through smaller objects such as pipes, taking photos and videos using a fish eye camera, transmitting them back to a base station for analysis.
