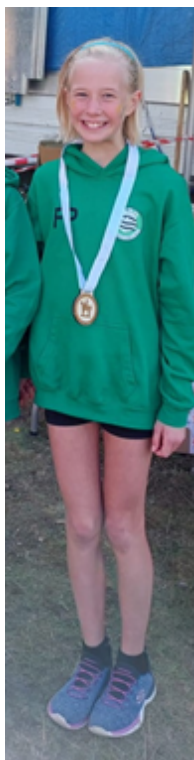

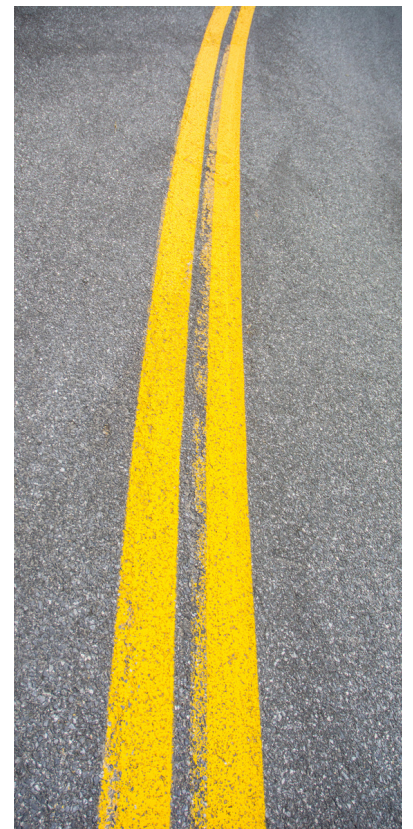
Our Change and Diversity prefects are working on events and an assembly to celebrate Black History Month.

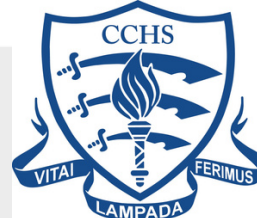
