Last week, our industrious Site Team oversaw the final phase of our roof replacement project. This project has taken place over two years, replacing the original 1907 slate roof and some aged flat roofing. This was a large project, costing approximately £450,000, that will see our facilities in good condition into the next century.

In addition to this, the team were busy redecorating and carpeting classrooms, supervising repairs to our entrance gate and monitoring the refurbishment of our astroturf, which removed 8 tons of sand. Alongside our statutory health and safety checks and other facilities upgrade work, our dedicated team continue to ensure that we have a campus to be proud of.
