As the Year Leader for Year 8, my job is to act as a signposting point between those members of my year group and the rest of the community: as a pastoral leader and supportive presence.

This encompasses a whole range of tasks and, indeed, very few days look too similar to the last, from those larger moments to the quotidian. Lost your shoes? Mr. Copper's Office; having a pencilcase-related emergency before a Maths test? Mr. Copper's Office; need help asking a teacher for extra help in their subject? Mr. Copper's Office. Equally, where students may need information or support in any capacity, my job is to ensure we are doing all we can as a school to support those in Year 8 and their families: overseeing Year 8's TA discussions, for instance, supporting the monitoring of attendance, triangulating with parents and carers, helping monitor Year 8 uniform and high behavioural standards, and offering mental health support and working alongside the Pastoral and Safeguarding teams.

The final key part of my role lies in the overseeing of my fantastic Year 8 Form Tutors and their formtimes and mornings often begin with my 8:20 'rounds' of the Year 8 rooms, leading into form-time activities. Some extra things I also do to get involved in with my role, though, are those like chipping in as a judge at a Year 8 House Event; delivering an assembly to the year group; or, on occasion, helping tape up a pair of glasses!

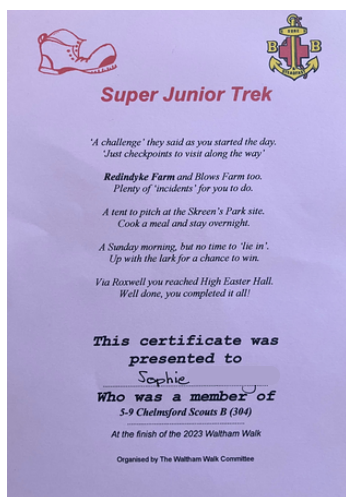
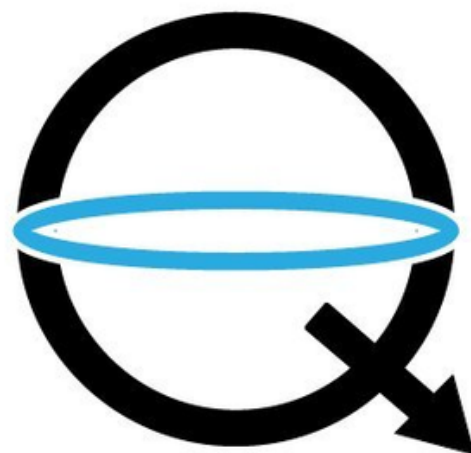

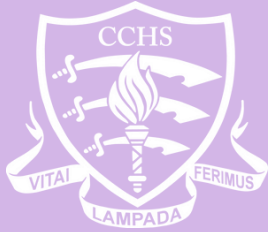
