Keep on swimming!



Context

The CCHS swimming pool was built in the 1960s, partly from funds raised by CCHS families. Dedicated upgrading and maintenance work over the years has ensured that the pool has served generations of students and young people across the Chelmsford community.

At the moment, our pool supports the PE curriculum for our 1,162 students, as well as nearly 200 pupils from five local primary schools, and nearly 600 young people from the wider community who use our pool with clubs.

Our swimming pool is truly a community pool.

Goal

Now is the time to modernise this important community resource to preserve it for future generations of students, pupils and young people. We are asking for your support now, just as the CCHS community rallied in the 1960s to ensure a pool was built, to help us achieve this important goal.

Fundraising

We estimate that the pool will require up to £250,000 over the next two years to bring it back to a suitable condition to support swimming in our community for the foreseeable future.

Our immediate need is to replace our aged boiler and gas pipework, which will cost approximately £35,000.



Following their excellent A level results, our former Year 13 students will soon be embarking on the next stages in their lives at university, taking gap years, etc.

The most popular universities for CCHS students are all in The Russell Group. This year our most popular destinations are the Universities of Bristol, York, Exeter, Nottingham, Leeds Sheffield and York which between them will be welcoming 60 students from CCHS. We are delighted with the range of institutions to which our students have been admitted, including those which are extraordinarily competitive such as the University of Cambridge, the London School of Economics and Imperial College London.

Students have elected to study a wide range of courses at their chosen universities. The most popular single choice is Medicine – seventeen students will be studying this – closely followed by eleven students reading Law and ten English Literature. Beyond these popular choices the range of course is wide and includes Accounting and Finance with Industrial Experience, Ancient History, Anglo-Saxon, Norse, and Celtic, Animation Production, Applied Psychology (Clinical), Architecture, Art and Design, Astronomy, Space Science and Astrophysics, Biochemistry, Biology, Biomedical , Science, Business Management, Chinese Studies and Linguistics, Civil Engineering, Computer Science, Criminology and Psychology, Dentistry, Economics, Engineering, Finance, Fine Art, Geography, Global Sustainable Development, Historical Archaeology, History, International Relations and French, Italian and Politics, Liberal Arts, Linguistics, Management, Marketing with Psychology, Mathematics, Medical Science, Modern Languages, Pharmacy, Music, Natural Sciences, Neuroscience, Optometry, Philosophy, Physics, Politics with International Relations, Primary Education, Professional Dance and Musical Theatre, Psychology, Religion, Society and Culture, Sociology, Sound and Music Production, and Spanish and Contemporary Chinese Studies. Students are also taking up prestigious and competitive Degree Apprenticeships in areas including both Law and Accountancy.

We wish all our former students well for the future. The universities they will be attending will be blessed to welcome and work with them, as we were. Many thanks to Mrs Hopkins in particular, our Higher Education Adviser, for the excellent support she provides to our senior students.


