This not only supports in developing their role in our school, or developing their work as classroom practitioners, but also enables us as a wider school community to engage with educational research to improve our whole school practices. This spotlight feature acts as a mechanism to showcase to our school community the ongoing professional development work undertaken by our talented staff.

Mr Selby

Hello! I'm Nina Lewis and I am a Year Leader and Teacher of Computer Science. As part of my Year Leader role, I was keen to understand more about culture and the impact this has on school outcomes, so I completed a 12-month NPQ course titled, 'Leading Behaviour and Culture'.

There were several key considerations that I took away from this course, but one fundamental point is that all effective learning environments are built on the value of trust. Students need to know they are safe, well-looked after and respected. In addition, consistency is key when building and maintaining high expectations of behaviour. As a staff body we are all in this together.

Upon completion of the NPQ I was asked to plan and deliver a CPD session, alongside our Senior Pastoral Leader, Mrs Chumbley, to all staff about low-level behaviour and what this looks like in our school. We worked with our teaching colleagues to develop approaches to best tackle low-level disruption in our lessons through sharing our experiences and ideas. We recognised that different subjects would experience different challenges and gave colleagues time for discussions within departments to take place. We ended our session with an action for Subject Leaders to review and adapt, if necessary, their own department behaviour policy to include guidance on how to manage low-level behaviour in their subject settings.




The CCHS U16 Badminton team have reached the Semi-Final of a National Competition.



Keep on suing!

Context

The CCHS swimming pool was built in the 1960s, partly from funds raised by CCHS families. Dedicated upgrading and maintenance work over the years has ensured that the pool has served generations of students and young people across the Chelmsford community.

At the moment, our pool supports the PE curriculum for our 1,162 students, as well as nearly 200 pupils from five local primary schools, and nearly 600 young people from the wider community who use our pool with clubs.

Our swimming pool is truly a community pool.

Goal

Now is the time to modernise this important community resource to preserve it for future generations of students, pupils and young people. We are asking for your support now, just as the CCHS community rallied in the 1960s to ensure a pool was built, to help us achieve this important goal.

Fundraising

We estimate that the pool will require up to £250,000 over the next two years to bring it back to a suitable condition to support swimming in our community for the foreseeable future.

Our immediate need is to replace our aged boiler and gas pipework, which will cost approximately £35,000.
