My name is Mrs Hiett and I teach Chemistry at CCHS, as well as being one of the Year Leaders in the Sixth Form. I am currently responsible for Year 12 and am also working on a project based around the GCSE-A Level transition, which we know can be an exciting but also sometimes challenging time for students. More recently I have taken an interest in improving the way we support disadvantaged students and specifically our Young Carers.

Leading on these different projects has shown me how it is possible to make life better for a greater number of students in a leadership role. This has been very rewarding but also opened my eyes to the challenges that come with introducing and embedding whole school initiatives, as well as giving me an insight into some of the aspects of school leadership that as a classroom teacher or middle leader you are not always aware of. In order to learn more about leadership in schools, I decided to undertake a National Professional Qualification for Senior Leadership (NPQSL) qualification this year.

I decided to complete my NPQSL with the Saffron Teaching Schools Hub, based in Saffron Walden, who deliver the Teach First programme. I am currently approximately halfway through the 18-month programme which covers a range of areas including school culture, implementation, and professional development. It is delivered mostly online but supplemented with in person conferences, and sharing ideas with a group of colleagues from other schools at similar stages of their careers has been a valuable aspect of the programme. Some of the modules have been more familiar to me and are directly related to the work I currently do, whilst others have allowed me to learn about things that I have previously known little about, for example school governance and accountability, but each has been interesting and useful in its own way.

I hope completing the NPQSL will equip me with the knowledge, skills, and confidence to continue moving forward with my career and, more importantly, to most effectively use the skills and experience that I have for the benefit of our students.



Keep on suing!

Context

The CCHS swimming pool was built in the 1960s, partly from funds raised by CCHS families. Dedicated upgrading and maintenance work over the years has ensured that the pool has served generations of students and young people across the Chelmsford community.

At the moment, our pool supports the PE curriculum for our 1,162 students, as well as nearly 200 pupils from five local primary schools, and nearly 600 young people from the wider community who use our pool with clubs.

Our swimming pool is truly a community pool.

Goal

Now is the time to modernise this important community resource to preserve it for future generations of students, pupils and young people. We are asking for your support now, just as the CCHS community rallied in the 1960s to ensure a pool was built, to help us achieve this important goal.

Fundraising

We estimate that the pool will require up to £250,000 over the next two years to bring it back to a suitable condition to support swimming in our community for the foreseeable future.

Our immediate need is to replace our aged boiler and gas pipework, which will cost approximately £35,000.
