Scenario 1

You still want to be friendly with them but have started feeling uncomfortable about how they're treating you.

TINO: Sure, you bet! Where's the party?


JAIDA: It's at Pete's Pizza Palace at 1 o'clock.

A friend doesn't say things like: "Your friend Kai is such a nerd, I can't stand him."


Instead, a friend might say: "I'm not crazy about Kai but he must be okay if he's your friend."


