	Invisible discrimination - behaviours that are subtle, indirect, or not immediately apparent. Discussion about how the media has changed over time to be more inclusive – disability, ethnicity etc.
Donations	These lessons, provided by the NHS, aim to introduce students to the importance of blood and stem cell donation. They include discussions on personal perspectives regarding blood donation—exploring reasons why individuals may choose to donate or not. Students will also examine the ethical and practical implications of organ donation systems, comparing the "opt-out" system to the "opt-in" system. Additionally, the lessons will highlight why the NHS urgently requires stem cell donations and the impact these donations can have on saving lives.
