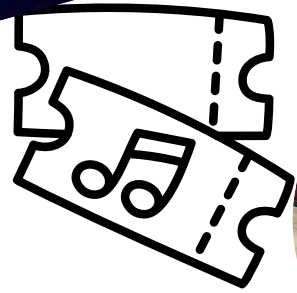

Corpus Christi's Easter Residentials are now open!

We are excited to announce that we have two Easter residential opportunities at Corpus Christi, Cambridge open to Year 12 students (Year 13 Northern Ireland / S5 Scotland). Medieval Worlds is back for 2026, and we are launching a brand-new residential programme for students who identify as having Black heritage. Accommodation and food are covered for both, with travel bursaries available for students who are eligible for government-funded Free School Meals.

Medieval Worlds (9-10 April 2026): Medieval Worlds is back for 2026, for aspiring medieval History, English, and Anglo-Saxon, Norse and Celtic students. Come and be immersed in the world of medieval manuscripts and texts at our one-night residential, run in partnership with the Parker Library.

- Open to all UK students in Y12 (Y13/S5) on track for A*AA and interested in the Medieval period.

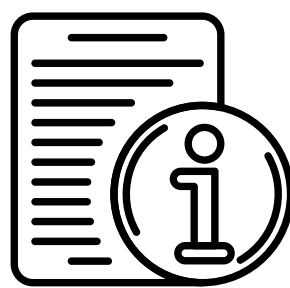
Corpus Black Brilliance Residential (1-2 April 2026): A brand new residential co-organised with our JCR Ethnic Diversity Officer for Year 12 students who identify as having Black heritage. Open to students across all humanities, social science and STEM subjects, including academic taster sessions, a Q&A with students from the Cambridge African Caribbean Society, three-course formal dinner, and application support sessions with the Admissions Team.

- Open to Y12 students (Y13/S5) at a maintained school who identify as having Black heritage, and are on track for A*AA (humanities) or A*A*A (STEM) in their A Levels.
